A BRIEF DESCRIPTION OF Professor Emeritus Dr. Amaresh Datta

Professor Emeritus Amaresh Datta, M, A. Ph. D., D. Lit. (Hon. Assam University, Silchar). D. Lit (Hon. Dibrugarh University, Dibrugarh) (b. Iswarshree, Karimganj District. Assam, 1919) is an outstanding scholar, critic and poet of our time. Identified by a panel of international academics (from Harvard, Yale and Uppsala Universities) in the 1950's, as one of the finest teachers of English literature in the country and as good as the best In their own Universities, Dr. Dutta left Sagar in M. P. to join Gauhati University as Reader in English in 1960. From January 1964 to February 1980. he was Professor and Head of the Dept. of English, Gauhati University, and from march 1980 to 1984, was Professor and Head of the Dept. of English, Dibrugarh University. A celebrated Shakespeare scholar, Dr. Datta's book. Shakespeare's Tragic Vision and Art (1963) received the highest accoiade from eminent scholars and critics like Professor G. Wilson Knight Dr. E. M. W. Tillyard, Professor A. G. Stock and others; Wilson Knight hailing this Indian contribution to Shakespeare studies in his book Shakespeare and Religion (1967). Dr. Datta's collection of poems, Captive Momeents (1952), bagged a prestigious award from the International Associatio of Poetry. Rome, in 1952. A number of poems from this anthology have been translated into Hindi, Marathi, Urdu and Italian. Professor Datta's knowledge of Indian literature - classical. medieval and modern - is as deep as it is wide and the first three volumes of the Encyclopaedia of Indian Literature (Sahitya Akademi: New Delhi. 1987, 1988, 1989) of which he was the Chief Editor, are a

monument to his scholarly zeal and initiative in this respect. Professor Datta visited the Soviet Union in 1987 as a member of the cultural delegation sponsored by the Government of India. His publications., besides articles and research papers on various topics include:

- Shakespeare's Tragic Vision and Art
- Time's Harvest (A collection of poems on selected episodes from the Ramayana and the Mahabharata)
- Lotus and the Cross (A poetic play a trilogy)
- Mysticism in Poetry
- India's Cultural Unity Fact or Fiction
- Poetry. Religion and Culture and Sankar Dev
- Banaprastha (A novel in Bengali)
- Andharater Jonakira (A collection of BengaU poems)
- In the valley of Time and Tide (A collection of English poems)
- Comedy: A Rhetorical Fiction: Five Essays on Shakespeare's Comedies.



TEACHING OF ENGLISH


Sir,


